

Role of Coordinator

- Represents and leads the project consortium
- Acts as intermediary between European Commision and partners
- Leads preparation and submits the project application
- Responsible for the effective & efficient implementation of the project if approved







Role of Partners

- Liaise with the Coordinator for the good management of the project
- Give the Coordinator all necessary information for project application and later implementation reporting
- Implement the project
- Lead specific parts / aspects of the project

Eligibility criteria



Relates to:

- The applicant
- Budget
- The submission formalities

Formal criteria to determine which proposals are eligible or not


- Answer by YES or NO
- Establish a list of eligible proposals







Exclusion criteria



Relates to the applicant, when:


- Bankruptcy procedure
- Conviction of an offence
- Serious professional misconduct
- Non-fulfilment social security or tax obligations
- Fraud, corruption
- Serious breach of contract







Selection criteria



Relates to evaluating the capacity of the applicants to implement the project



Financial capacity



Selection criteria



Operational capacity



Award criteria



To evaluate the quality of proposals and award funding to the best ones

- assessed by independent evaluators, in teams
- in one-stage or two-stage process
- 1. Excellence
- 2. Impact
- 3. Implementation

- Scoring
- Thresholds
- Weighting

Award criteria

Scoring:

Scoring must be in the range from 0-5. Half-marks may be given.

- 0 The proposal fails to address the criterion or cannot be assessed due to missing or incomplete information.
- 1 Poor. The criterion is inadequately addressed, or there are serious inherent weaknesses.
- **2** Fair. The proposal broadly addresses the criterion, but there are significant weaknesses.
- 3 Good. The proposal addresses the criterion well, but a number of shortcomings are present.
- 4 Very Good. The proposal addresses the criterion very well, but a small number of shortcomings are present.
- 5 Excellent. The proposal successfully addresses all relevant aspects of the criterion. Any shortcomings are minor.

Thresholds & weighting:

The threshold for the individual criteria is 3. The overall threshold, applying to the sum of the 3 individual scores, is 10 points.

Award criteria



Specific calls or topics may have different rules regarding threshols and weighting.

Specific cases:

Two-stage calls

For stage 1 proposals, only the criteria Excellence and Impact will be evaluated and within those criteria only the aspects indicated in bold in General Annex of the Main Work Programme. The threshold for each of the two individual criteria is 4

After the evaluation, the call coordinator will then fix an overall threshold, to limit the proposals that will be invited to stage 2. (This overall threshold will be set at a level which ensures that the total requested budget of proposals admitted to stage 2 is as close as possible to three times the available budget, and in any case, not less than 2.5 the available budget. The actual level will therefore depend on the volume of proposals received. The threshold is expected to normally be around 8 or 8.5.)



Applications must be evaluated as they were submitted, NOT on their potential if certain changes were made.



If an application is partly out of scope, this should be reflected in the scoring and explained in the comments.

Excellence evaluation



Applications must be evaluated as they were submitted, NOT on their potential if certain changes were made.

The following aspects will be taken into account, to the extent that the proposed work corresponds to the description in the work programme:

- Clarity and pertinence of the project's objectives.
- Quality of the proposed coordination and/or support measures including soundness of methodology.

Impact evaluation

Impact – aspects to be taken into account.

- Credibility of the pathways to achieve the expected outcomes and impacts specified in the work programme, and the likely scale and significance of the contributions due to the project.
- Suitability and quality of the measures to maximise expected outcomes and impacts, as set out in the dissemination and exploitation plan, including communication activities.

The results of your project should make a contribution to the expected outcomes set out for the work programme topic over the medium term, and to the wider expected impacts set out in the 'destination' over the longer term.

In this section you should show how your project could contribute to the outcomes and impacts described in the work programme, the likely scale and significance of this contribution, and the measures to maximise these impacts.

2.1 Project's pathways towards impact [e.g. 4 pages]

- Provide a narrative explaining how the project's results are expected to make a difference in terms of impact, beyond the immediate scope and duration of the project. The narrative should include the components below, tailored to your project.
 - (a) Describe the unique contribution your project results would make towards (1) the outcomes specified in this topic, and (2) the wider impacts, in the longer term, specified in the respective destinations in the work programme.

Implementation evaluation

Quality and efficiency of the implementation – aspects to be taken into account

- Quality and effectiveness of the work plan, assessment of risks, and appropriateness of the effort assigned to work packages, and the resources overall.
- Capacity and role of each participant, and extent to which the consortium as a whole brings together the necessary expertise.
- **3.1** Work plan and resources [e.g. 10 pages (13 pages for topics using lump sum funding) including tables]

Please provide the following:

- brief presentation of the overall structure of the work plan;
- timing of the different work packages and their components (Gantt chart or similar)
- graphical presentation of the components showing how they inter-relate (Pert chart or similar).
- detailed work description, i.e.:
 - a list of work packages (table 3.1a);
 - a description of each work package (table 3.1b);
 - a list of deliverables (table 3.1c);
